- Challenge with care and respect
- Respect and maintain confidentiality
- Ask for clarification when needed
- Be aware of sensitive topics like memories and values
- Use a person's preferred names and pronouns

We are striving to create a Brave Space in which we:

- Own our intentions and impact and acknowledge when dialogue affects the emotional well-being of a colleague / classmate
- Operate with respect of one another's personhood
- Agree to not intentionally inflict harm on others
- Take responsibility for engaging or disengaging with challenging conversations.
- Strive to create an environment where varying opinions are possible
